
#### Chloe (Crewe)

Sandown Carnival Association is celebrating the success of their application to the Big Lottery Fund. The association has been awarded £93000 from the Young Peoples Fund to deliver a three year programme of street art activities for young people 11-18 years of age.

The project will offer a range of activities and workshops over the next three years, which will provide young people with a range of opportunities to join in with workshops, courses and events on and off the Island.

The programme includes street performance, costume design and making, dance, flag and street decoration, DJ and PA courses as well as taking part in regular weekly summer activities, workshops with top London artists and opportunities to travel to the mainland to take part in carnivals and a chance to attend the Notting hill splash.

Jill Wade-Smith ' We are all delighted to have been successful in receiving the award, there was an enormous amount of time spent completing the application which included consultation with the young people in Sandown and Shanklin. The award will enable us to provide a lot of activities in the area for the young people and because the young people were so actively involved in contributing their ideas we know that the projects planned are what they want.'

Alan Ayres, Committee Chairman, says although the Big Lottery Fund has been award for the next three years of this project he is looking forward to the years beyond that. The committee will be trying very hard to make sure that the assets from the project, including the skills learnt by our young people, can be carried over into the future. We are particularly keen to build up to being part of the 2011 Island Games celebrations along with other Island Carnivals.

We hope that although Sandown Carnival has been awarded this fund, we are sure that all Island Carnivals will benefit in some way from each of the projects. As time goes on and as each of the strands of the project come on line we shall be inviting sections of our young people to join with us and to learn the skills and the fun that can be gained from being involved with Carnival
